Methodology

Included conditions: Unipolar/major depression, Bipolar disorders

Economic costs include: - All goods and services related to the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of the disorder (e.g. physician visits, hospitalizations and pharmaceuticals) - Other goods and services related to the disorder (e.g. social services, special accommodation and informal care) - Indirect costs (i.e. lost production due to work absence or early retirement)

The annual cost per person of the disorder was based on 'best estimates' derived from systematic literature reviews by panels of experts in epidemiology and health economics. Weighted averages were computed for all diagnoses and age groups within the disorder.

It is possible that extrapolation occurred across countries to fill in data gaps.



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
